November Workshop — November 19

MAKE THOSE MONOCHROMES SHINE: Using NIK Plugin for Adobe Photoshop with Emphasis on HDR EFex Pro 2 and Silver EFex Pro 2.

Part 1:

What makes a good monochrome photograph? In the film days, one could shoot black and white film and use their experience to create successful monochrome images. With the onset of digital photography, digital image manipulation software such as Adobe Photoshop and Lightroom allows photographers to capture color images and then decide whether to make them monochrome.

During this presentation, we will discuss a few basics on altering color images to monochrome, including which images are likely to make good monochromes (there is an easy trick for this using Adobe Camera Raw!). Keith will walk us through the process(es) he uses with a couple simple examples using Silver Efex Pro 2, and an example or two using HDR Efex Pro 2 together with Silver Efex Pro 2. The resulting images will then be tweaked in Photoshop to their final form.

Part 2:

Participants are encouraged to bring their laptop as well as some images to play with. The group can play with their images while Keith and hopefully other Photoshop savvy members will give pointers. Please bring your laptop and some images to play with! _____

Photographer Biography: Keith E. Goggin

Keith is a geologist who worked the first part of his career with the USGS and the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. Since 1997 he has been working in the oil and gas industry and retired in 2016. Keith bought his first camera (a Minolta X-700) in 1982, and switched to an Olympus OM-1 several years later. He spent the following 25 years concentrating on cave photography (mainly using a Nikonos IV or V) and landscapes, and even the occasional wedding (something he no longer does as a result of the lingering mother-in-law effect!). He has sold many prints, and has had numerous images published by magazines and used as book covers.

He was a late convert to digital photography, obtaining his first DSLR in 2009 when he bought a demo Nikon D-40 and two kit lenses for \$50.00 when Circuit City folded. This resulted in a renewed interest in photography (and the purchase of a *lot* more Nikon equipment!), and since there aren't any caves in Houston, he has been concentrating mainly on landscapes, nature and fine art photography. He is a member of the Houston Photographic Society, the Houston Camera Club, and is an honorary Fellow of the National Speleological Society as well as the recipient of the 2016 NSS Arts and Letters Award.
